For example, if English isn't your first language, we may be able to arrange a translator to help when speaking with us.

Updating your contact details helps us tailor our services to better meet your needs, especially if you have additional support requirements. By sharing this information, our Tenancy Sustainment Service can connect you with the right support to help you maintain your tenancy and access the services you need.

If you need documents in large print or prefer that we call or visit only at certain times, we can accommodate that. If you or someone in your home has a disability or other needs, we may be able to provide extra support.



Dispose of your rubbish safely





Tenants are responsible for disposing of their own household waste during and at the end of their tenancy. Please ensure that your rubbish is placed in the correct bins and in the designated area for collection to help keep Blackpool tidy.

If you have large items that you cannot dispose of such as furniture, electrical appliances, kitchen items etc. You can book a collection online from as little as £21 for 3 items through the Blackpool Council- Bulky Matters service.

Lumen Housing recognises the benefits to tenants of keeping pets. Keeping a pet at one of our properties will depend on the following information:



The size of your garden.



Where you live, the size and type of your home.



The type of pet and how many pets you want to keep at your home.

A request to keep a pet must be made in writing to our office: 348-350 Lytham Road, Blackpool, Lancashire, FY4 1DW or via email hello@myblackpoolhome.co.uk

You will receive a response to your request and the reasons as to why the pet has been granted approval or refused. Please do not obtain a pet prior to a response from us.

If due to medical conditions or a disability you require an assistance animal please contact us on 01253 477222 or hello@myblackpoolhome.co.uk to discuss further.



You must get our permission before getting a pet — not doing so breaches your tenancy and could lead to legal action.

General rules that apply to keeping pets:



The property type is suitable: A house or a flat with its own entrance (not communal) and access to an outdoor garden/yard) (not shared).



The Tenancy Agreement is complied with.



The pet's welfare will be assured at the address.



Pets (if applicable) must be vaccinated, microchipped, frequently flea treated, wormed and insured; we will require a copy of your pet insurance.



You can't keep an illegal animal- this is explained in the Dangerous Wild Animals Act 1976. If you own an XL Bully dog, you will need a certificate of exemption to legally keep your pet beyond 31 January 2024.



If we allow you to keep a pet, you must keep it under control, prevent damage or nuisance, clean up any mess, and repair any damage at your own cost. We take neighbour complaints seriously.



Your household contents are your responsibility and not the responsibility of the landlord. Contents insurance is designed to help protect possessions.



No matter how careful you might be, there's always a risk that belongings could be broken, damaged or stolen, so home contents insurance can help provide peace of mind should the worst happen.

Additionally, home contents insurance can be claimed in the event your possessions being damaged in a fire or flood. Some insurers will assist with recharge repair costs such as changing locks when keys are lost.
